- 4.4 Approval of the Memorandum Of Understanding (MOU) between NU-Humboldt Charter School and NU-Siskiyou Charter School:

Shari Lovett explained that employees who do jobs for both NU-HCS and NU-SCS are all paid through NU-Humboldt Charter School. This is due to the fact that both entities have the same federal tax ID # and only one W2 may be issued. This MOU allows for NU-Humboldt Charter School to invoice NU-Siskiyou Charter School for their portion of salaries and benefits of the shared employees. This year NU-Humboldt Charter School will invoice NU-Siskiyou Charter School two times rather than once as in the past. A motion to approve the MOU between NU-Humboldt Charter School and NU-Siskiyou Charter School was made by Rosemary Kunkler and seconded by Bianca Garza. She shared the Humboldt County Health Department's guidance that schools should go to distance learning for two weeks after Thanksgiving break. A parent spoke of being frustrated due to what she perceived as moving slowly in the re-opening process causing us to miss our opportunity to open. Another parent spoke about our students' need for us to move forward and that we cannot predict outcomes or a perfect moment to open. Staff expressed their opinion regarding reopening our facilities, including having students who needed support immediately.

A motion to move to phase three of reopening, allowing 1-1 intervention with high risk students, and a two-week closure following school breaks was made by Bianca Garza and seconded by Rosemary Kunkler. Vote taken: Bianca Garza – Aye, Rosemary Kunkler – Aye, Jeff Lanphere – Aye, and Jere Cox – Aye. Motion carries.

Shari Lovett asked about the 1-1 meetings following school breaks and the board clarified that staff could continue to have meetings with students needing intervention during the two weeks following a school break. A discussion on having parents sign

waivers was held. Shari Lovett stated that we can't ask families to sign waivers, but we can ask staff and families to sign an assumption of risk form. The board further clarified that families must have a signed assumption of risk on file prior to having in-person meetings.

Jere Cox called for a 10 minute break at 5:30pm. Jere Cox resumed the meeting at 5:40pm.

3.3 Approval of the Re-opening Criteria for Northern United Charter Schools' Facilities: Shari Lovett shared the criteria from the last board meeting. The board reviewed and made changes to the criteria. A motion to approve the reopening criteria with the changes as discussed and to have them be an ongoing agenda item for future evaluation was made by Rosemary Kunkler and seconded by Bianca Garza. Vote taken: Bianca Garza – Aye, Rosemary Kunkler – Aye, Jeff Lanphere –Aye, and Jere Cox – Aye. Motion carries. They approved the following criteria:

Reopening Criteria:

1. County positivity rate and adjusted case rate: 3% or lower in the prior 7 day period and the adjusted case rate over the last 7 day period remains below 5.

2. County is at an overall community risk level of Minimal (Tier 4) or Moderate (Tier 3) for one week, the school facilities will open. County is at an overall community risk level of Widespread (Tier 1) or Substantial (Tier 2) for any amount of time the school facilities will close.

3. Majority (51%) of the schools within the county are doing a hybrid approach or have open facilities.

4. Each facility is equipped with a three month supply of PPE, an air purification system and a cleaning schedule that allows for staff and student health and safety.

5. A necessary number of staff required to support cohorts as described by the State Public Health cohort guidance.

6. 100% of staff must complete Covid-19 and Integrated Pest Management (IPM) training.

7. Centers must submit and have approved a center-specific reopening plan.

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING BETWEEN SISKIYOU COUNTY OFFICE OF EDUCATION, SISKIYOU COUNTY SCHOOLS AND SISKIYOU COUNTY HUMAN SERVICES 2020/2021

THIS MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING sets forth the agreement between Siskiyou County Office of Education Foster Youth Service Coordination Program (SCOE), Siskiyou County Schools (DISTRICT) and Siskiyou County Human Services (AGENCY), relating to the new requirement under the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) and for services to support transportation of foster youth in Siskiyou County.

WITNESSETH:

Whereas, despite great progress having been made toward keeping Foster Youth in their home communities, it is still often necessary to meet the needs of foster children who have been placed far from their home and school; and,

Whereas, the DISTRICT and AGENCY agree that educational continuity is critical to the long term wellbeing of foster youth in Siskiyou County; and,

Whereas, it is recognized that when it is determined by the Educational Rights Holder (ERH) to be in the best interest of the student to place a child in foster care near his or her community and school of origin, doing so is considered as "best practice"; and,

Whereas, ESSA requires that DISTRICT and AGENCY share costs when providing said transportation services; and,

Whereas, the Foster Youth Services Coordinating Program (SCOE) is authorized under AB854 to utilize funding for transportation to the School Of Origin; and,

Whereas, parties to this agreement have a vested interest in seeking and encouraging the establishment of foster homes near the schools to which foster youth can conveniently attend;

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties hereto do mutually agree as follows:

1. Length of Agreement: July 1, 2020 through June 30, 2021.

2. SCOE responsibilities:

 a. SCOE shall serve as the liaison between the DISTRICT and AGENCY for purposes of performance of this agreement;

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- b. SCOE shall schedule and facilitate collaborative meetings between the DISTRICT and AGENCY as needed;
- c. SCOE shall track all relevant data related to this agreement and report to DISTRICT and AGENCY on a monthly basis.

3. DISTRICT responsibilities:

- a. Inform SCOE when one of its students requires said transportation services and provide SCOE all relevant information allowing SCOE to perform its responsibilities under this agreement.
- b. Collaborate with SCOE and AGENCY as needed to resolve any challenges that arise to ensure maximum educational continuity to impacted students.

4. AGENCY responsibilities:

- a. AGENCY shall make every effort to place the foster youth close to his or her home.
- b. When such placements are not appropriate or possible, AGENCY may pay the costs related to transporting foster youth to remain at their school of origin under ESSA guidelines.
- c. AGENCY shall immediately inform SCOE within one business day when it becomes aware of a foster youth requiring said transportation services and provide SCOE all relevant information allowing SCOE to perform its responsibilities under this agreement.
- d. AGENCY shall collaborate with SCOE and DISTRICT as needed to resolve any challenges as they arise to ensure maximum educational continuity to impacted students.

Further, in order to more fully define the process in this agreement, the following process is outlined:

- 1. When a foster youth's placement changes (either a child enters a foster placement for the first time or changes placements once in care), the AGENCY placement unit will call SCOE with information including, but not limited to, the child's name, DOB, school of attendance, old and new addresses, and contact information of the care provider and education rights holder. The call will be made no later than the following business day of the move. Information will then be communicated to SCOE in writing at the agency's earliest convenience.
- 2. SCOE will attempt to make contact with the Education Rights Holder (ERH) in order to determine if the ERH believes it is in the child's best interest to remain in the school of origin. Unless there is a clear indication that the ERH does not believe it is in the child's best interest to remain in the school of origin, every effort will be made to keep the child at that school. SCOE will reach out to DISTRICT of attendance to communicate the request of the ERH as it pertains to attendance in the school of origin.

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3. If the DISTRICT objects to the student remaining in the school of origin, said DISTRICT will call and inform the SCOE of their disagreement. The DISTRICT shall then submit to SCOE in writing the reason(s) for disagreement. During this period, it is understood the student will remain in the school of origin, as provided by law.

- 4. SCOE will assist the DISTRICT in the dispute resolution process. During the effort to resolve the dispute, the student will remain in the school of origin, as required.
- 5. SCOE will determine whether the DISTRICT will arrange and provide transportation or request the SCOE to make arrangements.
- 6. If the DISTRICT provides transportation, the DISTRICT will seek an interim service immediately, and establish a permanent schedule within 5 days. The DISTRICT will provide all information to the new care provider.
- 7. If SCOE is to arrange for transportation, the following steps will be taken:
 - a. SCOE will utilize Google Maps to determine the distance between the new residence and school or origin using the most reasonable route, and will consider the bell schedule and school calendar.
 - b. The current district bus schedules will be considered.
 - c. Public transportation, Siskiyou Transit and General Express (STAGE), will be the second preference for transportation, when available and practical. Staff will speak to the new care provider, social worker or any other responsible party, regarding the child's maturity level and ability to utilize public transportation. If public transportation is a valid option, then a bus pass will be provided to the new care provider for the child within 5 business days of the request.
 - d. If public transportation is not a viable option, service will be established within 5 days and relevant information will be communicated to the new care provider and social worker/Probation Officer. Interim solutions will be explored to minimize time spent out of school awaiting the establishment of transportation.
 - e. Individual cases where transportation is provided, may result in cost split between the DISTRICT and AGENCY.

8. INDEMNIFICATION

For DISTRICT:

The DISTRICT and SCOE will maintain worker's compensation coverages for its activities under this Agreement. Both organizations participate in the North Eastern Joint Powers Authority (NEJPA) and Northern California Schools Insurance Group (NCSIG) for workers compensation and liability insurance.

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For AGENCY:

AGENCY agrees to defend, indemnify, and hold harmless SCOE, its agents, employees, and/or volunteers from any and all claims, demands, losses, damages and expenses, including legal fees and costs, or other obligation or claims arising out of any liability or damage to person or property, or any other loss, sustained or claimed to have been sustained arising out of activities of the AGENCY or those of any of its agents, employees, or subcontractors of AGENCY, whether such act or omission is authorized by this Agreement or not. AGENCY shall also pay for any and all damage to the Real and Personal Property of the SCOE, or loss or theft of such Property, done or caused by such persons. SCOE assumes no responsibility for any property placed on SCOE premises by AGENCY, AGENCY agents, employees or subcontractors. AGENCY further hereby waive any and all rights of subrogation that it may have against the SCOE. The provisions of this Indemnification do not apply to any damage or losses caused solely by the negligence of the SCOE or any of its agents, employees, and/or volunteers.

SCOE agrees to defend, indemnify, and hold harmless AGENCY and its agents, employees, and/or volunteers from any and all claims, demands, losses, damages and expenses, including legal fees and costs, or other obligations or claims arising out of any liability or damage to person or property, or any other loss, sustained or claimed to have been sustained arising out of activities of the SCOE or those of any of its agents, employees, or subcontractors of SCOE, whether such act or omission is authorized by this Agreement or not. SCOE shall also pay for any and all damage to the Real and Personal Property of the AGENCY, or loss or theft of such Property, done or caused by such persons. AGENCY assumes no responsibility whatsoever for any property placed on AGENCY premises by SCOE, SCOE's agents, employees or subcontractors. SCOE further hereby waives any and all rights of subrogation that it may have against the AGENCY. The provisions of this Indemnification do not apply to any damage or losses caused solely by the negligence of the AGENCY or any of its agents, employees, and/or volunteers.

- 9. This Agreement may only be terminated through written notice 30 days in advance of intent to withdraw from the agreement being provided to all other parties.
- 10. The parties agree that amendments may only be made through mutual consent of the parties hereto, and prior to the renewal of said agreement.

4.7 Certification of Northern United - Humboldt Charter School's First Interim Budget

School districts and charter schools are required to file two reports during a fiscal year (interim reports) on the status of the LEA's financial health. The First Interim report is due December 15 for the period ending October 31. The Second Interim report is due March 17 for the period ending January 31. County superintendents are to report to the Superintendent of Public Instruction and the State Controller the certification for all districts in their county within 75 days after the close of the reporting period.

The interim reports must include a certification of whether or not the LEA is able to meet its financial obligations. The certifications are classified as positive, qualified, or negative. A positive certification is assigned when the district will meet its financial obligations for the current and two subsequent fiscal years. A qualified certification is assigned when the district may not meet its financial obligations for the current or two subsequent fiscal years. A negative certification is assigned when a district will be unable to meet its financial obligations for the remainder of the current year or for the subsequent fiscal year. In addition, the Superintendent of Public Instruction may reclassify the certification of any county office of education or reclassify a certification based on an appeal of a school district in accordance with the above standards.

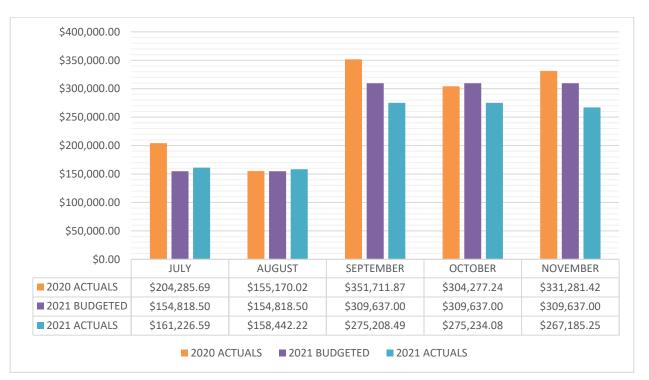

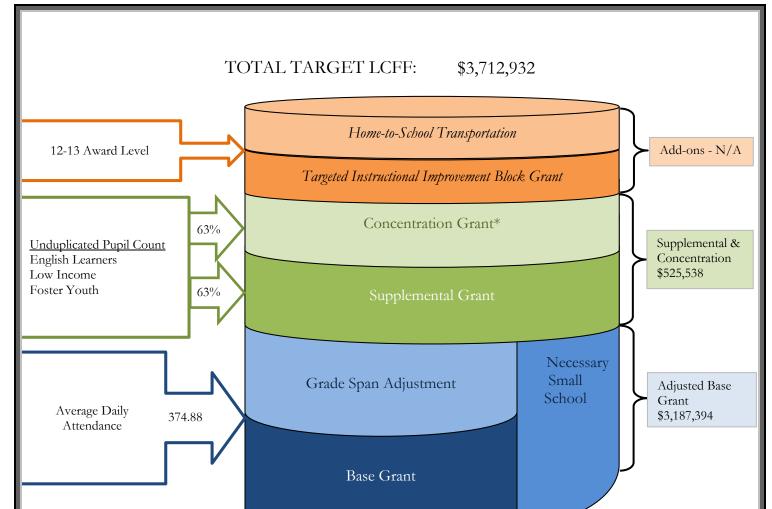

Uniform Complaint Procedures (UCP)

This document contains rules and instructions about the filing, investigation and resolution of a Uniform Complaint Procedures (UCP) complaint regarding an alleged violation by Northern United Charter Schools of federal or state laws or regulations governing educational programs.

This document presents information about how we process UCP complaints concerning particular programs or activities that are subject to the UCP.

A UCP complaint is a written and signed statement alleging a violation of federal or state laws or regulations, which may include an allegation of unlawful discrimination, harassment, intimidation or bullying. A signature may be handwritten, typed (including in an email) or electronically generated. Complaints may be filed anonymously. A UCP complaint filed on behalf of an individual student may only be filed by that student or that student's duly authorized representative.

A complainant is *any* individual, including a person's duly authorized representative or an interested third party, public agency, or organization who files a written complaint alleging violation of federal or state laws or regulations, including allegations of unlawful discrimination, harassment, intimidation or bullying in programs and activities funded directly by the state or receiving any financial assistance from the state.

If the complainant is unable to put the complaint in writing, due to a disability or illiteracy, we shall assist the complainant in the filing of the complaint.

Northern United Charter Schools (NUCS) developed the Uniform Complaint Procedures (UCP) process with policies and procedures adopted by the board.

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According to state and federal codes and regulations, the programs and activites subject to the UCP are:

- Accommodations for Pregnant and Parenting Pupils
- Adult Education
- After School Education and Safety
- Agricultural Career Technical Education
- Career technical and technical education and career technical and technical training programs
- Child care and development programs
- Compensatory Education
- Consolidated categorical aid programs
- Course Periods without Educational Content

• Discrimination, harassment, intimidation, or bullying against any protected group as identified under *Education Code (EC)* sections 200 and 220 and *Government Code* Section 11135, including any actual or perceived characteristic as set forth in *Penal Code* Section 422.55, or on the basis of a person's association with a person or group with one or more of these actual or perceived characteristics, in any program or activity conducted by an educational institution, as defined in *EC* Section 210.3, that is funded directly by, or that receives or benefits from, any state financial assistance.

• Educational and graduation requirements for pupils in foster care, pupils who are homeless, pupils from military families and pupils formerly in Juvenile Court now enrolled in a school district

- Every Student Succeeds Act
- Local control and accountability plans (LCAP)
- Migrant Education
- Physical Education Instructional Minutes
- Pupil Fees
- Reasonable Accommodations to a Lactating Pupil
- Regional Occupational Centers and Programs
- School Plans for Student Achievement
- School Safety Plans
- School Site Councils
- State Preschool
- State Preschool Health and Safety Issues in LEAs Exempt from Licensing

And any other state or federal educational program the State Superintendent of Public Instruction (SSPI) of the California Department of Education (CDE) or designee deems appropriate.

The following complaints shall be referred to the specified agencies for appropriate resolution and are not subject to the our UCP complaint procedures set forth in this document:

(a) Allegations of child abuse shall be referred to the applicable County Department of Social Services (DSS), Protective Services Division or appropriate law enforcement agency.

(b) Health and safety complaints regarding licensed facilities operating a Child Development Program shall be referred to DSS.

(c) Employment discrimination complaints shall be sent to the State Department of Fair Employment and Housing (DFEH). The complainant shall be notified in writing in a timely manner of any DFEH transferal.

The Responsibilities of Northern United Charter Schools

We shall have the primary responsibility to ensure compliance with applicable state and federal laws and regulations. We shall investigate and seek to resolve, in accordance with the our approved UCP process, complaints alleging failure to comply with applicable state and federal laws and regulations including, but not limited to, allegations of discrimination, harassment, intimidation, or bullying or noncompliance with laws relating to all programs and activities we implement that are subject to the UCP.

The UCP Annual Notice

We disseminate on an annual basis the UCP Annual Notice which is a written notice of the our UCP complaint procedures.

This notice may be made available on our website and shall include the following:

• addresses all of our students, employees, parents or guardians of its students, school and charter advisory committee members, appropriate private school officials or representatives, and other interested parties;

• information regarding allegations about discrimination, harassment, intimidation, or bullying;

• the list of all federal and state programs within the scope of the UCP;

• the title of the position whose occupant is responsible for processing complaints, and the identity(ies) of the person(s) currently occupying that position, if known;

• a statement that the occupant responsible for processing complaints is knowledgeable about the laws and programs that they are assigned to investigate;

Filing UCP Complaints

All UCP complaints shall be filed no later than one year from the date the alleged violation occurred.

A pupil fee includes a purchase that a pupil is required to make to obtain materials, supplies, equipment, or clothes associated with an educational activity.

A pupil fees complaint may be filed with the principal of a school or with our school director or their designee. A pupil fees complaint may be filed anonymously, that is, without an identifying signature, if the complaint provides evidence or information leading to evidence to support an allegation of noncompliance.

For complaints relating to Local Control and Accountability Plans (LCAP), the date of the alleged violation is the date when the reviewing authority approves the LCAP or annual update that we adopted. An LCAP complaint may be filed anonymously, that is, without an identifying signature, if the complaint provides evidence or information leading to evidence to support an allegation of noncompliance.

We advise complainants of the right to pursue civil law remedies that may be available under state or federal discrimination, harassment, intimidation or bullying laws, including, but not limited to, injunctions, restraining orders, or other remedies or orders that may also be available to complainants.

Investigating UCP Complaints

The UCP complaint investigation is our administrative process for the purpose of gathering data regarding the complaint. We provide an opportunity for complainants and/or representatives to present evidence or information.

Refusal by the complainant to provide the investigator with documents or other evidence related to the allegations in the complaint, or to otherwise fail or refuse to cooperate in the investigation or engage in any other obstruction of the investigation, may result in the dismissal of the complaint because of a lack of evidence to support the allegations.

Refusal by NUCS to provide the investigator with access to records and/or other information related to the allegation in the complaint, or to otherwise fail or refuse to cooperate in the investigation or engage in any other obstruction of the investigation, may result in a finding based on evidence collected that a violation has occurred and may result in the imposition of a remedy in favor of the complainant.

We ensure that complainants are protected from retaliation.

We investigate all allegations of unlawful discrimination, harassment, intimidation or bullying against any protected group. Unlawful discrimination, harassment, intimidation or bullying complaints shall be filed no later than six months from the date the alleged discrimination,

harassment, intimidation or bullying occurred, or six months from the date the complainant first obtained knowledge of the facts of the alleged discrimination, harassment, intimidation or bullying.

UCP Complaint Resolution

We will thoroughly investigate the UCP complaint and issue a written Investigation Report to the complainant within 60 calendar days from the date of the receipt of the complaint, unless the complainant agrees in writing to an extension of time.

This Investigation Report will contain the following elements:

• the findings of fact based on the evidence gathered;

• a conclusion that provides a clear determination for each allegation as to whether we are in compliance with the relevant law;

• corrective actions if we find merit in a complaint:

- including complaints of Pupil Fees; LCAP; Physical Education Instructional Minutes, or Course Periods without Educational Content, the remedy shall go to all affected pupils, parents, and guardians,

- for all other complaints within the scope of the Uniform Complaint Procedures the remedy shall go to the affected pupil,

- With respect to a pupil fees complaint, corrective actions shall include a remedy where in good faith, by engaging in reasonable efforts, an attempt to identify and fully reimburse all pupils, parents and guardians who paid a pupil fee within one year prior to the filing of the complaint;

• a notice of the complainant's right to appeal our Investigation Report to the Department of Education (CDE); and

• the procedures to be followed for initiating an appeal to the CDE.

UCP Complaint Appeal Process

An appeal is a written and signed request by the complainant to the CDE seeking review of an LEA Investigation Report that was issued in response to a properly-filed complaint. A signature may be handwritten, typed (including in an email) or electronically-generated.

The complainant may appeal our Investigation Report of a UCP complaint to the CDE by filing a written appeal within 30 calendar days of the date. In order to request an appeal, the complainant must specify and explain the basis for the appeal, including at least one of the following:

• NUCS failed to follow its complaint procedures, and/or

• the Investigation Report lacks material findings of fact necessary to reach a conclusion of law, and/or

• the material findings of fact in the Investigation Report are not supported by substantial evidence, and/or

• the legal conclusion in the Investigation Report is inconsistent with the law, and/or

• in a case in which we were found in noncompliance, the corrective actions fail to provide a proper remedy.

The appeal shall be sent with: (1) a copy of the locally filed complaint; and (2) a copy of the LEA Investigation Report.

Andrea Marchyok, a teacher at our Mt Shasta Learning Center has been holding weekly writer's workshops with our 6th and 7th grade students. She said the group is exploring different styles of writing; essay, narrative, expository. The students have several weeks per assignment to write the piece. They are getting really great at giving each other feedback along the writing process. They read the final piece, and submit it. The current unit is Powerful Individuals, Powerful Movements.

Mystery Science At-home Experiments:





Stabile Sculpture - we learned about Alexander Calder and made these out of Taskboard - it's a natural wood-based medium that's bendable. It's called "stabile" because they are made with a paper pulp that is actually made with wood pulp and could be balanced on the table. This student chose to hang his. We ordered many boxes of books from one particular company this summer. They used a lot of extra cardboard as packing material. After helping teachers organize the books on shelves, Laurie Gardner, our secretary, recognized that the extra cardboard was the perfect size to make a gingerbread house. She found plans online that she prototyped and put together these great kits to send home to our Pine Grove families. Parents and students will assemble them and decorate them however they choose. We will have photos of their creations for the next board meeting. Everything about these is recycled, even the bags she put the pieces in!



Here are photos of the bags she put together:

In Yreka, we have started our Positive Prevention Plus sexual health classes for students in grades 8 and 12. Two students were opted out by parents. A nurse from SCOE is managing the courses for us. There are three weekly online assignments in the PP+ curriculum, and one weekly Zoom meeting among the students, the nurse, and a NUCS credentialed teacher. We have volunteered to take turns as there are 10 total Zoom meetings, five for each grade level.

CAASPP testing is still scheduled to take place, albeit in a slightly shortened version. Plans are to provide a remote testing option for students to test at home as needed. Specifics are still being finalized, but there will be a requirement that teachers can observe students while they test via their webcam.
