School districts and charter schools are required to file two reports during a fiscal year (interim reports) on the status of the LEA's financial health. The First Interim report is due December 15 for the period ending October 31. The Second Interim report is due March 17 for the period ending January 31. County superintendents are to report to the Superintendent of Public Instruction and the State Controller the certification for all districts in their county within 75 days after the close of the reporting period.

The interim reports must include a certification of whether or not the LEA is able to meet its financial obligations. The certifications are classified as positive, qualified, or negative. A positive certification is assigned when the district will meet its financial obligations for the current and two subsequent fiscal years. A qualified certification is assigned when the district may not meet its financial obligations for the current or two subsequent fiscal years. A negative certification is assigned when a district will be unable to meet its financial obligations for the remainder of the current year or for the subsequent fiscal year. In addition, the Superintendent of Public Instruction may reclassify the certification of any county office of education or reclassify a certification based on an appeal of a school district in accordance with the above standards.

# Northern United Humboldt Charter School Budget Three Year Review 2023-24, 2024-25 & 2025-26 First Interim

This transmittal document is provided as supporting information to the 2022-23 First Interim cycle for Northern United Humboldt Charter School. The document consists of the budget year and two subsequent years.

#### **Enrollment and Average Daily Attendance (ADA)**

Enrollment projections are based on current year enrollment and attendance trends. We used a 95% attendance rate for the revenue projections in all three years. Current year ADA of 301.15 is based upon enrollment estimate of 317 students.

#### 2024-2025 & 2025-2026

Both years assume ADA of 301.15 based on an estimated enrollment of 317.

#### Revenues

With the exception of Special Education and Local Revenues, revenues are calculated using the Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF) Calculator with Department of Finance (DOF) COLA for all budget years. Below is a summary of LCFF Revenue components for all budget years:

#### **Federal Revenues**

Title II - Improving Teacher Quality revenue is projected to be in the amount of \$11,554 and maintain that level for the two multi-years.

The Rural and Low-Income Schools (RLIS) revenue is projected to be in the amount of \$10,080 and maintain that level for the two multi-years.

Special Ed Grant Entitlement -Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA) is projected to maintain Budget Adoption level of \$50,052 in all three budget years.

#### Other State Revenues

Lottery revenue of \$177 per ADA unrestricted and \$72 per ADA restricted is based on 2023-24 estimated P-2 ADA adjusted for annual, is projected to be \$53,304 unrestricted and \$21,683 restricted.

Mandate Block Grant funding was added to the budget for all three years in the amount of \$8,190.

The Community Engagement Initiative Grant revenue of \$70,000 has been added to the current year only.

Universal Pre-K Planning and Implementation Grant funds of \$102,107 have been added to the current year only.

#### Other Local Revenues

Local interest revenue is budgeted at \$4,164 for 2023-2024 and maintain that level for the two multi-years.

Local revenue for the MBH Grant from HCOE has been added to the current year only.

Local revenue for the business services MOU with Pacific View Charter School has been added to all three years.

The Special Ed transfer of apportion from the County Office of Education is projected to be \$169,469 and maintain that level for the two multi-years.

## Personnel

#### 2023-2024

### Certificated

In 2023-2024, total Certificated salaries and wages are projected to increase by \$19,317 since Budget Adoption. This includes hiring a community school coordinator and additional stipend opportunities for staff.

#### Classified

In 2023-2024, total Classified salaries and wages are projected to increase by \$156,220 since Budget Adoption. This includes the addition of a secretary at ELC, instructional aides at CLC and stipend opportunities for staff, students and community members through the CEI grant.

#### 2024-2025 & 2025-2026

### Certificated

The first Multi-Year budget projects a decrease in Certificated salaries and wages of \$91,958 due to the removal of stipends from the CEI grant and salaries and benefits from the Community School Planning Grant. The second Multi-Year projected an increase of \$10,830. This is due to step increases.

#### Classified

The first Multi-Year budget projects a decrease in Classified salaries and wages of \$4,690. This is due to step increases and the reduction of stipends for the CEI grant. The second Multi-Year budget projects an increase in Classified salaries and wages of \$1,700. This is due to step increases.

Statutory benefits are based on state and federal guidelines and information on individual participation in retirement plans.

The California State Teachers' Retirement System (STRS) budgeted rates are 19.10% in 2023-2024, 19.10% in 2024-2025 and 19.10% in 2025-2026. The California Public Employees' Retirement System (PERS) budgeted rates are 26.68% in 2023-2024, 27.70% in 2024-2025 and 28.30% in 2025-2026.

The Workers Compensation Rate is 0.73% in all three budget years.

The Health and Welfare expense budget is based on current projections for JPA rates in 2023-2024 and employee participation in benefits plans. The subsequent budget year projections are based on the continued cap of Spruce Tiered Plans.

### Other Expenditures:

Other expenditures are based on prior year patterns and estimated chargeback information from the SELPA.

6.5 Certification of Northern United - Siskiyou Charter School's First Interim Budget with Budget Transfer Resolution

### **Action Requested:**

#### Previous Staff/Board Action, Background Information and/or Statement of Need:

School districts and charter schools are required to file two reports during a fiscal year (interim reports) on the status of the LEA's financial health. The First Interim report is due December 15 for the period ending October 31. The Second Interim report is due March 17 for the period ending January 31. County superintendents are to report to the Superintendent of Public Instruction and the State Controller the certification for all districts in their county within 75 days after the close of the reporting period.

The interim reports must include a certification of whether or not the LEA is able to meet its financial obligations. The certifications are classified as positive, qualified, or negative. A positive certification is assigned when the district will meet its financial obligations for the current and two subsequent fiscal years. A qualified certification is assigned when the district may not meet its financial obligations for the current or two subsequent fiscal years. A negative certification is assigned when a district will be unable to meet its financial obligations for the remainder of the current year or for the subsequent fiscal year. In addition, the Superintendent of Public Instruction may reclassify the certification of any county office of education or reclassify a certification based on an appeal of a school district in accordance with the above standards.

7.1 Discuss Driver Criteria and Eligibility Policy Revisions

### Action Requested:

Discussion

#### Previous Staff/Board Action, Background Information and/or Statement of Need:

This policy was brought to the board on 11/15/23 for consideration of revisions. The revision would align with CharterSafe's recommendation for a minimum school vehicle driver's age. Currently our policy has no minimum driver age. CharterSafe recommends 24 years old as the minimum age. Northern California Schools Insurance Group JPA in Siskiyou County requires the driver must be at least age 21 to drive for business purposes and age 25 if transporting students, possessing a valid California driver's license, and have been continuously licensed for a minimum of 3 years. In Humboldt County, the North Coast Schools Insurance Group JPA does not have a set policy regarding age of a driver for district-sponsored transportation, and legally a bus driver can be 18 years old. They do have a field trip driver policy for when a student is being transported in a private vehicle, and the age requirement for that is 21 years old.

# E-46 Driver Criteria and Eligibility Policy

Adopted 9/20/2018, 10/21/2019, 10/14/2021

Only approved employees of Northern United Charter Schools will be allowed to drive school vehicles.

All employees of Northern United Charter Schools shall be required to submit a vehicle request form prior to the use of any school vehicle.

Northern United Charter Schools reserves the right to refuse an employee authorization to operate a vehicle on school business or be reimbursed mileage if the individual is determined to be a negligent operator or fails tomaintain a valid California driver's license.

Northern United Charter Schools shall maintain a list of approved employees who are authorized to operate school vehicles orto operate private vehicles on school business (including field trips). The school shall maintain a list of approved volunteers who are authorized to operate private vehicles on school business (including field trips).

No student may drive him/herself without written permission from a parent/guardian. Written permission must be on file with the Charter School prior to the event. No student may ever drive another student(sibling excepted).

A "school vehicle" is defined as a motor vehicle owned by Northern United Charter Schools and used for the purpose of moving or propelling any person or property upon a highway for school business.

Application and enforcement of this policy shall be on a retroactive basis for volunteers, but not for employees; i.e. volunteers may lose their driving privileges immediately upon policy enactment based on their driving record over the prior five years, but enforcement relative to employees (other than for voluntary driving not related to their job) shall be based on points earned after policy enactment.

# E-46 Driver Criteria and Eligibility Policy Revision 11-08-2023

Adopted 9/20/2018, 10/21/2019, 10/14/2021

Only approved employees of Northern United Charter Schools that are over the age of 24 will be allowed to drive school vehicles.

All employees of Northern United Charter Schools shall be required to submit a vehicle request form prior to the use of any school vehicle.

Northern United Charter Schools reserves the right to refuse an employee authorization to operate a vehicle on school business or be reimbursed mileage if the individual is determined to be a negligent operator or fails to maintain a valid California driver's license.

Northern United Charter Schools shall maintain a list of approved employees who are authorized to operate school vehicles or to operate private vehicles on school business (including field trips). The school shall maintain a list of approved volunteers who are authorized to operate private vehicles on school business (including field trips).

No student may drive him/herself without written permission from a parent/guardian. Written permission must be on file with the Charter School prior to the event. No student may ever drive another student(sibling excepted).
